Post-party Clear up

Freshen up your home after the party season with these chemical-free treatments

veryone loves a good party and this year, as we celebrate the arrival of a new century, they'll be bigger than ever before – and so will the morning-after clean-up.

Luckily there are plenty of

chemical-free cures for getting rid of wine stains, candle wax and the smell of stale smoke:

TEA & COFFEE STAINS

Spray the stain with soda water and then sponge on borax solution. Borax is a harmless and deodorising mineral available from most chemists. You can also use a combination of 5ml glycerine and 2 drops tea tree oil. This mixture can also be used for wine stains. BEER STAINS Quickly soak the stain with bicarbonate of soda, dry, then brush off. LIPSTICK Rub in glycerine and leave for an hour, then sponge area with eucalyptus oil and wash in warm, soapy water. CANDLE WAX Place kitchen paper over the wax then iron on medium heat to absorb it.

RED WINE Cover the stain with salt or mineral water as soon as possible. If it's on the carpet, leave the salt for five minutes and blot the area with a clean towel. If the stain is on a garment, cover the item with salt and then rinse with cold water.

CIGARETTE BURNS Rub fabric burn stains with the edge.

fabric burn stains with the edge of a silver coin; to remove them from a table, mix borax and glycerine into a paste, cover stain, leave for ten minutes, then sponge off; or rub them with glycerine, from Boots.

■ GREASY MARKS Remove greasy marks from wallpaper by rubbing them with a piece of bread. If the grease is on a garment, then take a note from Alan Hayes, author of It's So Natural (Gill & Macmillan, £7.99) and use eucalyptus oil, blended with 450g of grated pure soap, 50g of borax and three tosp of methylated spirits. Blend the soap and the borax together and mix over heat. Leave mixture to harden and then grate. Add the methylated spirits to the flakes and leave overnight. After this period, add 1 tbsp of eucalyptus oil. You should use 1 tbsp of the

mixture with 9 litres water.

HEAT DAMAGE Polished surfaces can be spoiled by white rings left by hot cups and plates. These can be removed by dipping a duster into a mix of ten drops each of linseed

and tea tree oils, and applying a little elbow grease.

4 Finally, brush the pile when
the carpet is almost dry.
